AIR SPRING REMOVAL

- 1. RAISE THE VEHICLE.
- 2. REMOVE THE APPLICABLE REAR WHEEL.
- 3. REMOVE WHEEL WELL LINER.
- 4. USE THE SCAN TOOL TO DEFLATE THE AIR SPRING INTO THE RESERVOIR.

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5. LOOSEN AND REMOVE THE AIR LINE. (FIGURES 1, 2)

6. PUSH IN THE LOCKING TABS AND PUSH DOWNWARD ON THE AIR SPRING TO DISLODGE IT FROM THE VEHICLE. (FIGURES 3, 4)

AIR SPRING INSTALLATION



Tighten all nuts and bolts to manufacturer's specifications during the installation process.

OE AIR FITTING REMOVAL



PRIOR TO INSERTING THE EXISTING AIR LINE INTO THE NEW AIR FITTING YOU WILL NEED TO REMOVE THE OLD ORIGINAL EQUIPMENT AIR LINE FITTING.

NOTE: SCRATCHES AND/OR DEEP CUTS IN THE AIR LINE CAN RESULT IN POSSIBLE LEAKS. INSPECT THE AIR LINE BEFORE INSERTION. AIR LINE NEEDS TO BE REPLACED IF DAMAGED.



OE AIR LINE FITTING

SLIDE THE THREADED PORTION UP THE LINE AND SPREAD THE COLLET OPEN TO REMOVE

SLIDE THE AIR FITTING OFF OF THE AIR LINE

AIR LINE IS READY FOR INSTALLATION

ARNOTT AIR FITTING INSTALLATION



- 5. REMOVE JACK OR STAND FROM PREVIOUS STEP AND ENSURE AIR SPRING IS SEATED BEFORE CONTINUING WITH FULL INFLATION.
- 6. INFLATE AIR SPRING COMPLETELY. (FIGURE 11)



- 7. CHECK THE SYSTEM'S TOTAL AIR MASS TO ENSURE THAT IT MEETS MANUFACTURER'S SPECIFICATIONS.
- 8. REINSTALL THE WHEEL WELL LINER.
- 9. REINSTALL THE WHEEL.
- 10. LOWER THE VEHICLE.
- 11. INSTALLATION COMPLETE.

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
